Qualifications & Skills Required

- Terminal EHS Visits for site risk assessment, leadership coaching, culture development and site specific EHS program implementation.
 - Implement the Metro Ports Corporate EHS Management System that identifies and reduces overall EHS risks identified for the Eastern Terminals.
 - Maintain the terminal specific risk registers and support implementation of action plans
 - Implement the Terminal Specific EHS Field Guides with all of its operating strategies for EHS Improvement, including training, frequent reference, etc.
 - Lead and coach Terminal Superintendents with regard to their EHS duties and accountabilities.
 - Ensure adequate training (both regulated EHS and incident prevention) is taking place along with required documentation for terminal operating tasks.
 - Conduct Leadership Training that sustains the EHS Management System and supports culture change for the current day EHS Focus.
- Implement and carry out training with regard to the effective use of the EHS Data Management System (Dakota) in all six program elements and at each terminal, which includes creating an effective calendar for tracking of all compliance related requirements; ie, environmental permitting, OCC health testing, training and certifications.
- Identify all Occupational health risks and carry out appropriate testing.
- Implement effective Occupational Health Risk Controls.
- Provide strategic planning, budgeting and reporting to EHS Director and Terminal Managers with regard to EHS System integrity, progress and sustainability, which includes preparing various reports, including statistical injury, trend analysis, and other reports as needed.
- Assist Terminal FSO's to manage facility Security Plans and security training in each marine terminal managed by Metro Ports.
- Monitor and make aware of pending and current legislative changes affecting Company's safety program.
- Carry out effective incident investigation/ Root Cause Analysis, case management and reporting to governing agencies as well as implement a sustainable site emergency response plans.

Education and/or Work Experience

- 4-year college degree in applicable field of study.
- CSP or ASP (with intent of obtaining CSP)
- Knowledge of state and federal OSHA, U.S. Coast guard regulations, PCMSC, and other safety regulatory requirements for the maritime industry.
